This regional, highly acclaimed music camp designed for grades 3-12 has been a summer course here in Trumbull for more than 45 years. The music lessons are taught by certified music teachers for Strings, Brass, Woodwind, Percussion and Guitar. Instruction is provided for all levels: Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced. The curriculum provides experience in String and Full Orchestra, Concert Band, Jazz Ensemble, Chorus, Music Technology, and Guitar Ensemble. Performance opportunities include solo and small ensembles, weekly recitals, and an evening concert program at the culmination of the camp. Camp meets on weekdays and a supervised recreation program is included in each day. All Beginner students must obtain an instrument prior to the first day of camp. DRIVER EDUCATION PROGRAM Knepler Driving Schools

Must be 16 yrs

This course meets the full 30-hour mandatory requirements as the mandatory 8-hour Drug and Alcohol program, and 15, two-hour online classroom sessions with one makeup class at the end. The parent/student mandatory program must be attended by one parent or legal guardian and the student together on the evening assigned as there is no makeup for this class. This program will be offered for \$180.00 (this includes a \$5.00 non-refundable processing fee) and does not include any on road driving lessons. All fees are final and non-refundable. You must be at least 16 years of age to start the online classroom program.

All classes will meet via ZOOM and will be taught by Howard Knepler. All students will require an electronic device with a camera and microphone and must have an internet connection. Smartphone, laptop, tablet, or desktop are sufficient. If more than one class is missed no certificate will be issued. Please contact the instructor about other options available. School rules apply during online classroom sessions.
